BSA Religious Emblem Programs

(Revised November 1, 2005)

- **Light of Christ** – This program helps Tiger and Wolf Cub Scouts (1st and 2nd grades) develop a personal relationship with Jesus. They come to see Jesus as a real person and friend. A Cub Scout earns this religious emblem by completing all of the steps outlined in the Light of Christ Activity Book, to the satisfaction of his parents, *before* he starts the third grade.
- **Parvuli Dei** – This program helps Bear and Webelos Scouts (3rd, 4th, and 5th grades) explore a wide range of activities that help them discover the presence of God in their daily lives, as a member of a family, parish, and community. A Cub Scout earns this religious emblem by completing all of the steps outlined in the Parvuli Dei Activity book, to the satisfaction of his parents, *before* he becomes a Boy Scout or finishes the fifth grade.
- **Ad Altare Dei** – This program helps registered Boy Scouts, who have completed the sixth grade, *before* beginning this program, and are not yet 18 years old. The program typically takes a school year to complete and assumes that through formal religious education, each Scout has and is receiving a solid foundation of religious knowledge. Participating Scouts relate the knowledge of their faith, especially in areas of the seven Sacraments, to their normal, ordinary experience in life. Their active participation in the Church should develop important new meanings. The local Catholic Committee on Scouting requires that a Trained Counselor conduct this program.
- **Pope Pius XII** – In the Columbus Diocese, this program is available to any registered Catholic Venturer or Boy Scout who has started 9th grade and *has already earned the Ad Altare Dei* emblem. Under the direction of a trained counselor, the program is typically completed during a weekend sleep over in a cabin, with an advance reading prerequisite. The Pope Pius XII program deals with Church-related ministries and vocations. These are the ways baptized persons commit themselves to serve humanity in obedience to God's call within the church, a Christian community of faith. The goals of the program are (a) to have each participant examine how being a Christian affects his daily life in the real world, (b) to challenge each participant to evaluate his personal talents and abilities in light of a possible choice of lifestyle, vocation or ministry that relates in some way to belonging to and becoming increasingly more active in the Catholic Christian faith community, and (c) to give each participant the opportunity to share his faith and practice his religion among peers, while receiving guidance and feedback attuned to the ideals of Scouting.
- **Pope John Paul II Patch** – The goal of this new program is to encourage people of all ages to search deeper into the roots of Pope John Paul II and to learn about him and his views, especially on Life. Most of the questions are well suited for discussion. This program should be light, yet serious, and it wants to be user friendly for any family, Troop, Crew or other group in its endeavors to build camaraderie and a better understanding of the life of John Paul II. A five-inch patch is earned by completing the requirements for one's current age, within these categories: first through fifth grade; sixth through twelfth grade; and adult.
- **Rosary Patch Program**–The Rosary Patch Series will focus each of four years on a different set of Mysteries of the Holy Rosary. This is an opportunity for youth and adults alike to learn more about their faith. There will be a series of four patches that will run as follows: 2004 - Joyful Mysteries Patch; 2005 - Mysteries of Light Patch; 2006 – Sorrowful Mysteries Patch; 2007 – Glorious Mysteries Patch. There are different requirements for three age groups, and everyone is required to answer correctly at least 5 of 10 questions for his/her age group. The program is open to everyone interested in participating. This is a non-restrictive program and may be earned by any youth or adult, male or female.
- **International Awareness** – The Pope and the International Catholic Conference of Scouting (ICCS) demonstrate their awareness of Scouting in the Catholic Church throughout the world, by providing this opportunity for its members to meet together as friends in the Catholic Church. The ICCS develops, links, and enhances the spiritual dimension of Scouting from the point of view of the Catholic faith and Catholic Church within the World Scouting Movement. This International Awareness program offers a fascinating program with the Eastern Rite Catholic Church and attractive activity recognitions of: Pin and Patch for Cub Scouts, and Pin, Patch and Medallion for all others. You may wear the pin, patch, or medallion at your own discretion wherever and whenever. This is a non-restrictive program and may be earned by any youth or adult, male or female.
- **Santa Maria** – In 1992, this program was inspired by the 500th anniversary of Christopher Columbus' discovery of America. Participants will discover how Columbus and his crew brought Catholicism and Christianity from the Old World to the New World. This program is presented at the Holy Family Catholic Museum and a sleepover on board the Santa Maria ship. Older Scouts lead small discussion groups. This program is available to any Catholic, male or female, youth or adult, who is at least 11 years old and registered in Scouting. A three-hour, abbreviated program is available for Cub Scouts. Upon completion, a patch is available as a memento and personal recognition
- **St. Tarcisius** – This program's focus is on the Holy Eucharist and becoming more aware of the real presence of God in our life, especially through the Holy Eucharist. Participants also learn to appreciate their Catholic Faith more, through small discussion groups, led by older Scouts, and the fun exercises they enjoy. The program is available to any Catholic, male or female, youth or adult, who is at least 11 years old and registered in Scouting.
- **Founders of Faith in Ohio** – This program was inspired by the 2003 celebration of the Bicentennial Anniversary of the State of Ohio. Participants explore the growth of the Catholic Church from its beginnings in Maryland to its expansion west through Appalachia and into the Ohio Territory. The program explores several biographies of key individuals who sparked the flame of Catholicism in the Country, as well as the great state of Ohio. Older Scouts lead discussions and facilitate an overnight weekend program that is usually conducted near the location where the first Mass was celebrated in Ohio, outside of Somerset. The program is available to any Catholic, male or female, youth or adult, who is at least 11 years old and registered in Scouting.
- **Pope Paul VI National Unit Recognition** –The equivalent of the Catholic church's National Quality Unit Award, similar to the BSA's Annual Quality Unit Award. Every Scout unit under Catholic auspices should apply each year. This program promotes Catholic Membership; recognizes the Catholic Parish; strengthens the unit and its adult leadership. It provides each youth with a top-quality program, which encompasses the religious, vocational, and educational aspects of Scouting Units may earn this recognition on their own merit for a particular charter or calendar year and may qualify again in succeeding years if the annual requirements are again met, as determined by the local Catholic Committee on Scouting. An appropriate liturgical presentation ceremony may be arranged, according to the customs of the local diocese.
